4 MEET SOME NEW FRIENDS BEFORE THE PERFORMANCE.

5 REPEAT AS NEEDED.

All shows average between 70–100 minutes or less. Shows run back-to-back with 60 minutes between to allow for travel or chatting between shows. See as many as you like!

Make sure to compare thoughts and ideas with your fellow audience members. (Chatting is the best way to catch the buzz.)

INTERESTED IN SEEING MULTIPLE PERFORMANCES?

Consider buying a Fringe Pass. They give you the flexibility you need and allow you to save money at the same time.

All Access Pass \$300

See as many shows as you want with an All Access Pass. The pass holder can reserve tickets in advance to any show or get their tickets at the door free of charge. See 20 shows and the pass has paid for itself. See more and you start saving (as well as developing calluses on your feet).

The Six Pack \$75

This flexible pass will get you six tickets for the price of five. To make it even more exciting, you can use the pass in whatever way you want. Take six people to one show or go get one ticket to six.

PLEASE NOTE

- All tickets are General Admission.
- Seating is done on a first come first serve basis.
- Tickets cannot be exchanged or refunded except in the event of a show cancellation.
- Latecomers will not be admitted.
- Photo ID required at many venues, please have one at all times.
- Summer in DC can be hot. Please prepare for warm weather.



GETTING TO THE FRINGE

With so many fantastic performances to see, we want to make sure that the last thing you worry about is how to get there. Look for the “Getting There” information specific to each performance venue in this program, but before you launch yourself, take a moment to get the big picture on traveling in Downtown DC.

TRANSIT

Washington, DC has one of the best transit systems in the country. Use it. Whether you are riding the Metro, a Metrobus, or a Circulator bus, you can use a SmartTrip card to pay your fare. SmartTrip cards can be purchased at the Metro Sales Office located in the Metro Center station at 12th and F St. NW. You can add value to the cards in any Metro Rail station using cash or credit cards.

Almost every venue is easily accessible by Metrorail, Metrobus, and Circulator. The Circulator is \$1 and runs every 8-10 minutes. Check out dcccirculator.com for the routes and stops near Festival venues.

Metrobus costs \$1.25, and Metrorail costs a minimum of \$1.35 depending on the distance you travel. Metrobus runs with decreasing frequency in the evening hours. Check your bus schedule online at MetroOpensDoors.com. Metrorail opens at 5am on weekdays, 7am on weekends, and closes at midnight Sunday–Thursday. Metrorail stays open until 3am on Friday and Saturday night.

BIKING

Getting around downtown on a bicycle is quick and easy. Get a free city bike map and biking advice from the Washington Area Bicyclists Association (WABA). They can be found on the web at WABA.org, or by phone at 202-518-0524, and the offices are located at 1803 Connecticut Avenue NW, 3rd Floor. Bring a good lock. Put a removable light on your bike. Wear a helmet, bright colors or tuck a reflective vest into your bag.

WALKING

DC is a great city for walking. Ask the Downtown BID SAMs on the street for a free map, directions, or suggestions on where to eat after the show. SAMs are the friendly people dressed in red uniforms outside Metro exits and on busy street corners. Also, look for the big blue wayfinding signs to point you in the right direction for popular destinations and landmarks.

STREET PARKING

There are lots of meters downtown, but make sure you read the signs to know the hours they are in effect. In general, most street parking is prohibited during rush hours that occur from 7am–9:30am, and from 4pm–6:30pm. When in doubt, do not park on the street between those hours.

OFF-STREET PARKING

Although there are many off-street parking options in downtown, most of them close before 10pm. Check out the hours of the parking garage closest to your performance venue by going to goDCgo.com's interactive transportation map.

GETTING AROUND THE FRINGE

Almost all of the performances are located in the District of Columbia. When you come downtown for the Fringe, be sure to also take in the neighborhood and nightlife. Eat dinner, have drinks, shop and take in all that downtown DC has to offer. Sometimes the best show at a Fringe is watching the world go by.

Fringe productions are broken up into two categories:

FRINGE RUN VENUES

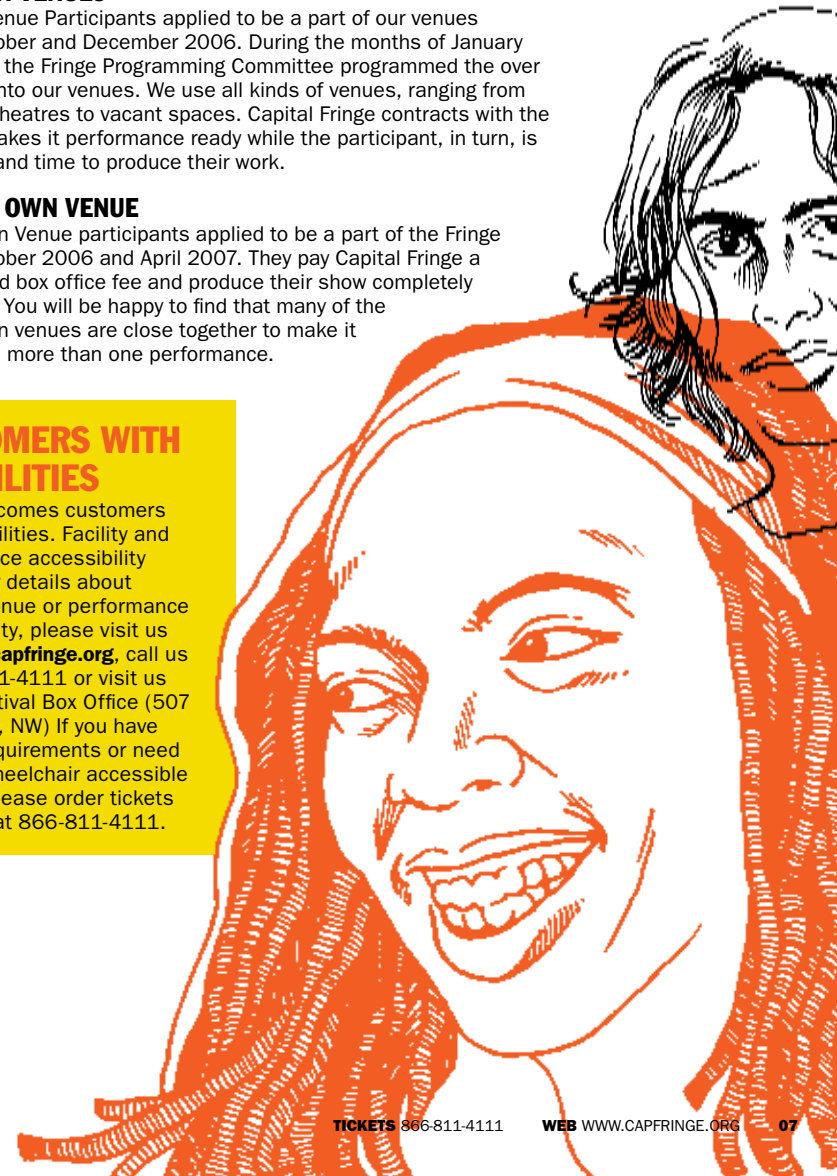
Fringe Run Venue Participants applied to be a part of our venues between October and December 2006. During the months of January and February the Fringe Programming Committee programmed the over 100 groups into our venues. We use all kinds of venues, ranging from established theatres to vacant spaces. Capital Fringe contracts with the venue and makes it performance ready while the participant, in turn, is given space and time to produce their work.

FIND YOUR OWN VENUE

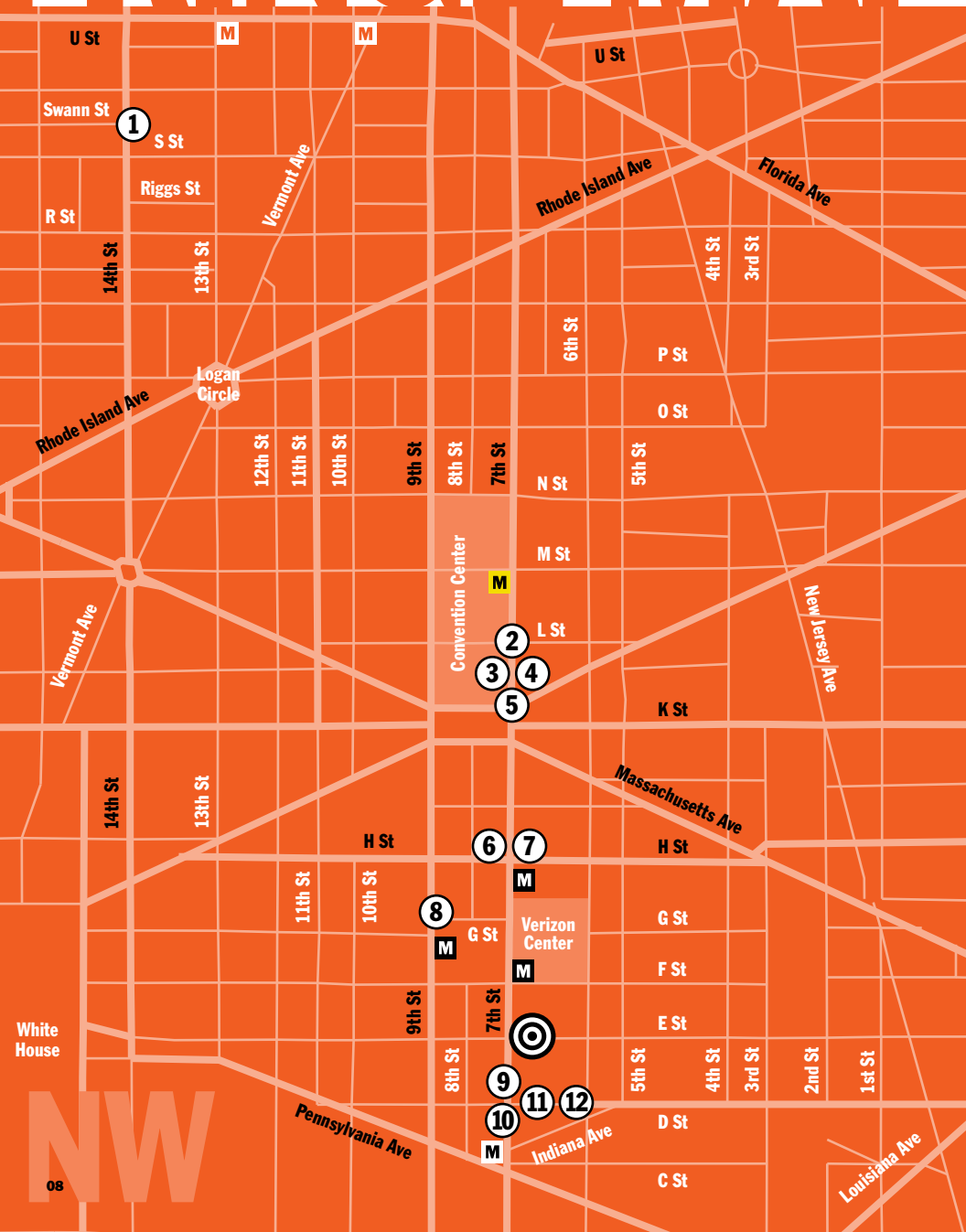
Find Your Own Venue participants applied to be a part of the Fringe between October 2006 and April 2007. They pay Capital Fringe a marketing and box office fee and produce their show completely on their own. You will be happy to find that many of the Find Your Own venues are close together to make it easy to catch more than one performance.

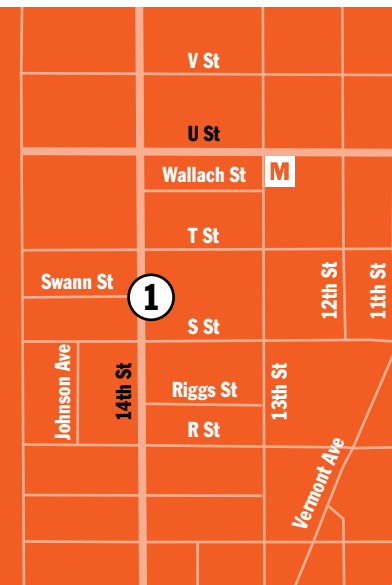

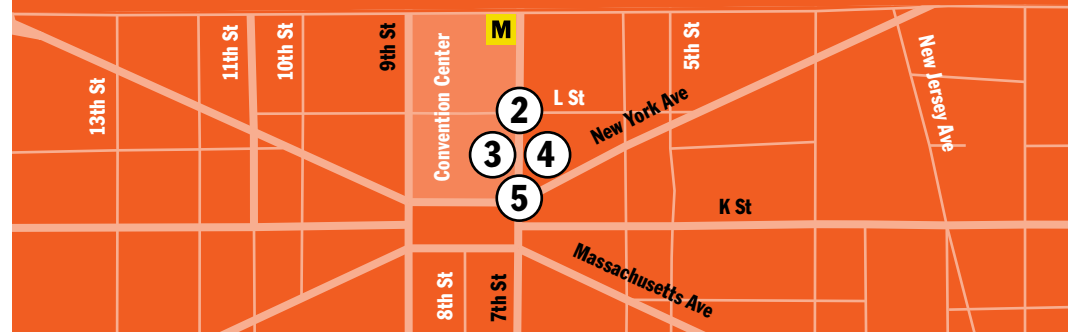

In their café you can eat a grilled cheese sandwich, have some blow-your-mind espresso, or knock back an ice cold organic lager. Take a load off in a comfy chair and read your guide. Be sure to check out the Colosseum—a completely Fringe-designed and somewhat ironically-named venue. Warehouse Arts is Washington's leading independent art space. Created in 1994, the complex includes two theatres, a live music venue, a screening room, and several gallery spaces. 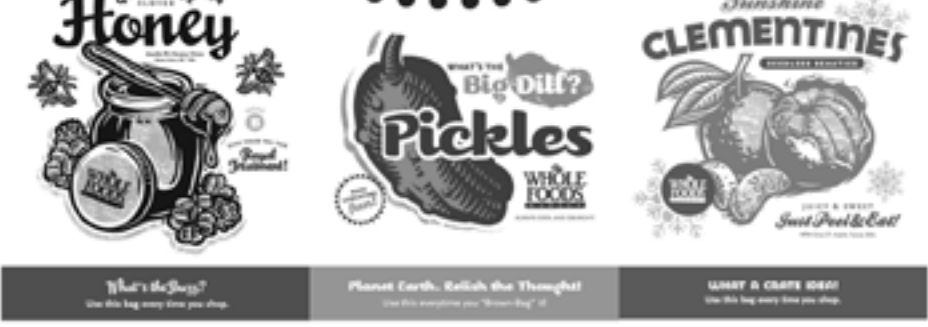
This installation is produced with the generous support of The Downtown Business Improvement District, a private, nonprofit organization that provides safety, hospitality, sanitation, homeless, economic development, transportation and streetscape and marketing services to Washington's center city. The BID's mission is to help raise downtown to world class standards as a commercial, cultural and residential destination. The vacant space has been provided free of charge by Douglas Development.

THE ARTISTS

Robert Cole has lived many lives as an artist. Originally, he studied architecture at Virginia Tech, but then changed colleges and majors, first to theatre then to painting. He started his sculpture career by building models for home furnishings, and then began working on abstract and figurative pieces in polyester resin. He built and designed stringed instruments for twelve years and carved wood and stone. For the past ten years he has been employing the direct metal technique which has proven to satisfy his need to work in a medium that can reach a large scale, survive in the outdoors, and be made entirely in his own studio by hand. Robert has numerous works in the D.C. area—ranging from monumental public sculpture to furniture and functional sculpture for many businesses to smaller figurative work in countless private collections. His sculpture, music and irrepressible spirit have made an indelible mark on the Washington arts scene.

Scot McKenzie has inhabited the minds and bodies of many characters as an actor. Throughout his youth, Scot studied and experimented with the performing and visual arts—nurturing a fascination with three-dimensional form and sculpture. Never limiting himself to one discipline, he constantly seeks to challenge himself in the realms of art, architecture, language and science. Initially a nutrition major, he changed colleges and majors and graduated from Davis & Elkins College with majors in Theater and Spanish. He was able to combine both subjects while studying Movement and Theater in Mexico. After 2 years of performing Shakespeare across North America, Scot arrived in Washington and began a 7 year apprenticeship with Robert—immersing himself in direct metal sculpture in the mediums of steel, stainless steel and bronze. He has designed and built sets featuring his own metal sculptures. Scot continues to create memorable roles on stage and film, in Washington and beyond. Scot is also the Technical Director for the Fringe and you can see more of his work at the Scientarium.

Together, the two have collaborated in several capacities. Scot has assisted Robert on numerous monumental and smaller works. He joined Robert in Florence, Italy to produce a 1 ton, 16 ft. piece for the Florence Biennale. Transforming his Dupont Circle studio into a performance venue, Robert has served as producer for The Little Globe Theater, co-founded by Scot.
