Consider buying a Fringe Pass to get two benefits at once: flexibility and savings.

ALL ACCESS PASS \$300

See as many shows as you want with an All Access Pass. The pass holder can reserve tickets in advance to any show or get tickets at the door free of charge. See 20 shows and the pass has paid for itself. See more and you start saving (as well as developing calluses on your feet). When you buy an All Access Pass you get a free Fringe Button!

"110-PROOF" PASS \$110

This flexible pass will get you 10 tickets to whatever shows you want to see. You can use this pass in whatever way you want. Ten friends can go to one show or a couple can go to five shows or you can

get one ticket to 10 different shows. When you buy a 110-Proof Pass you get a free Fringe Button!

THE SIX PACK \$75

This flexible pass will get you six tickets to whatever shows you want to see. To make it even more exciting, you can use the pass in whatever way you want. Six people can go to one show, three people can go to two shows, or one person can go to six shows or...

THE FORTY PASS \$50

This flexible pass will get you four tickets to any festival production you want.

PLEASE NOTE

- All tickets are General Admission.
- Seating is done on a first come first serve basis.
- Tickets cannot be exchanged or refunded except in the event of a show cancellation.
- Latecomers will not be admitted, except at the discretion of the Vouse manager; check venue listing
- Photo ID required at many venues, please have one at all times.
- The Fringe is about exploration; if unsure what to see, visit our Box Office for tips on choosing a show.
- Summer in DC can be hot - and not all Fringe venues have AC. Please prepare for warm weather.

GETTING

WITH SO MANY FANTASTIC PERFORMANCES TO SEE, WE WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT THE LAST THING YOU WORRY ABOUT IS HOW TO GET THERE. LOOK FOR THE “GETTING THERE” INFORMATION SPECIFIC TO EACH PERFORMANCE VENUE IN THIS PROGRAM, BUT BEFORE YOU LAUNCH YOURSELF, TAKE A MOMENT TO GET THE BIG PICTURE ON TRAVELING IN DOWNTOWN DC. SEE OUR ATTACHED MAP TO ORIENT YOURSELF AND GET THERE QUICKER.

TRANSIT

The District has one of the best transit systems in the country. Use it. Whether you are riding the Metro, a Metrobus, or a Circulator bus, you can use a SmartTrip card to pay your fare. SmartTrip cards can be purchased at the Metro Sales Office located in the Metro Center station at 12th and F St. NW. You can add value to the cards in any Metro Rail station using cash or credit cards. Almost every venue is easily accessible by Metrorail, Metrobus, and Circulator. The Circulator is \$1 and runs every 8-10 minutes. Check out dccirculator.com for the routes and stops near Festival venues. Metrobus costs \$1.35, and Metrorail costs a mini-

mum of \$1.35 depending on the distance you travel. Metrobus runs with decreasing frequency in the evening hours. Check your bus schedule online at MetroOpensDoors.com. Metrorail opens at 5am on weekdays, 7am on weekends, and closes at midnight Sunday- Thursday. Metrorail stays open until 3am on Friday and Saturday night.

BIKING

Getting around downtown on a bicycle is quick and easy. Get a free city bike map and biking advice from the Washington Area Bicyclists Association (WABA). They can be found on the web at WABA.org, or by phone at 202-518-0524, and

the offices are located at 1803 Connecticut Avenue NW, 3rd Floor. Bring a good lock. Put a removable light on your bike. Wear a helmet, bright colors or tuck a reflective vest into your bag.

WALKING

DC is a great city for walking. Ask the Downtown BID SAMs on the street for a free map, directions, or suggestions on where to eat after the show. SAMs are the friendly people dressed in red uniforms outside Metro exits and on busy street corners. Also, look for the big blue wayfinding signs to point you in the right direction for popular destinations and landmarks.

STREET PARKING

There are lots of meters downtown, but make sure you read the signs to know the hours they are in effect. In general, most street parking is prohibited during rush hours that occur from 7am-9:30am, and from 4pm-6:30pm. When in doubt, do not park on the street between those hours.

OFF-STREET PARKING

Although there are many off-street parking options in downtown, most of them close before 10pm. Check out the hours of the parking garage closest to your performance venue by going to goDCgo.com's interactive transportation map.

CUSTOMERS WITH DISABILITIES

Fringe welcomes customers with disabilities. Facility and performance accessibility varies. Fringe Training Factory supports the development of emerging artists and companies in the Washington, DC area. It is both a forum for learning and a playground for artists to explore their craft in a creative, supportive and instructive setting. The goal of the Training Factory is not to teach artists, but rather to enable artists to collaborate and learn from each other through practical application.

FRINGE TRAINING FACTORY

Workshops

Workshops last about one hour and are open to Fringe artists and the general public. Tickets are available in advance purchase or reservation online or at the door. Workshops are held at Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Library, 901 G St NW. Metro stops Gallery Place-Chinatown (Red/ Green/Yellow) and Metro Center (Red/Blue/Orange) are each a block away from the Library. Leave Gallery Place by the 9th Street/Galleries exit or Metro Center by the 11th Street exit for the shortest walk.
