- + Focused on the performing arts: Theatre, dance, puppetry, spoken word, but may include film and visual arts
 - + Uncensored: All content is created and produced by the artist
 - + Easy to participate in: Ticket prices are low for audiences and production fees are low for artists
 - + Original: Fringe features a huge array of original material
 - + Rapid-fire: Tech is minimal (minor sets, nothing elaborate) and shows are often around 60 minutes in length

FORT FRINGE: 607 New York Ave NW Washington, DC 20001 is the central hub of the Capital Fringe Festival. It houses three festival venues, the Baldacchino Gypsy Tent Bar and the Festival's main box office.

PRE-FESTIVAL:

June 18 3:30pm-11pm; July 6 4pm-11pm;
July 10 and 11 Noon-7pm.

DURING THE FESTIVAL:

Tuesday - Thursday, 3pm-11pm;
Friday - Noon to Midnight
Saturday and Sunday, 10am-Midnight.

AT THE FESTIVAL VENUES: Patrons can purchase single tickets and admission buttons for specific shows 45 minutes prior to curtain. Passes are only available for purchase at the main box office or capitalfringe.org

IN ADVANCE: Call (866) 811-4111 Mon-Fri, 9am-9pm; Sat-Sun, 10am-11pm. You can also buy tickets online at capitalfringe.org

FRINGE ADMISSION BUTTONS

\$7. All ticket holders (except for kids 12 and under) must have a Fringe admission button for entrance. Buttons are a one-time purchase, but must be presented or worn for entrance to each show. No exceptions.

SINGLE TICKET PRICE

\$17 + Fringe admission button required. Browse the individual show pages to purchase single tickets.

MULTI-SHOW FESTIVAL PASSES

One Fringe Admission Button included in each multi-show festival pass purchase. Multi-show festival passes are non-refundable and non-exchangeable.
